# Some of the names and attributes of our God:

In more or less alphabetical order, and each with at least one reference from Scripture. The fourth word in the Bible is Elohim ("In the beginning, Elohim ...") and doesn't argue the case for the existence of God. Thus, the Bible begins with God, He simply is - without question. This list is not an exhaustive one, but, having originally started the list as "The names of our God," then found many more, I felt obliged to rename this list as "Some of the names of our God," as there may well be many more that I haven't yet discovered. This list then, is simply of those which I have discovered up to the date at the bottom of the list, they are mostly Old Testament names, so I assume that there are more, of which I am not aware, in the New Testament. If you can point me in the direction of others not listed here, please feel free to let me know. Our contact details etc. are at the end of this list, followed by an index.

Where there are different meanings for the same Hebrew word, or different words for the same meaning, one must always look at the context. This is advisable anyway, in every case.

- 1. **Abba** (Romans 8:15) Meaning "**Father**" or "**Daddy**." What a privilege this, to call the Lord God of Isra'el, the creator of all things, Father, or, more intimately, Daddy!
- Adon or Adonai (Genesis 15:2) Meaning "My Lord," or "My Master," the Headship Name. The word may be applied to God or to man, but in the latter case, the word starts with a lower case "a." Adon is the singular form, Adonai being the plural form. The implication in the use of this word is the right to absolute obedience and the servant's right to have clear direction in service. In many cases, Adonai may be substituted for "Elohim" or "Jehovah" in the compound names of Elohim or Jehovah below.
- 3. ADONAI (Frequent usage) Meaning "The Lord" or "The Master."
- 4. **ADONAI 'Elyon** (Psalm 7:17) Meaning "The Lord, the God most high" or "The Lord, the supreme God" or "The Lord, the uppermost God."
- 5. Adonai Jehovah (Genesis 15:2) Meaning "Master God" as in the sense of "Lord God." This name is used when the emphasis is more on the Adonai aspect of God's character than the Jehovah aspect.

- 6. Adonai-Jehovah-Saboath (Psalm 69:6) Meaning "Master, Lord of Hosts."
- 7. Adonai Shamah (Ezekiel 48:35) Meaning "The Lord is There," or "The Lord is ever-present." This name signifies the abiding presence of the Lord with His people, hence it applies to both Isra'el and to believers. This is the same as Jehovah Shammah.
- 8. Adonai-Tzva'ot (Jeremiah 31:34) Meaning "Master (or Lord) of Hosts" or "Master (or Lord) of Armies."
- 9. 'Attiiyq Yowm (Daniel 7:9 but read the whole chapter) Meaning "The Ancient of Days." This occasion is in the middle of another of his visions, some of which he understood to be for the immediate time, others were for the future.
- 10. Avi-'Ad (Isaiah 9:6) Meaning "Father of Eternity."
- 11. Cether (Psalm 32:2) Meaning, God, "My Hiding Place."
- Ehyeh Asher Ehyeh (Exodus 3:14) Meaning "I am/will be what I am/will be." The name given to Moses when he asked God His name.
- 13. **El** (Genesis 14:18) Meaning, quite simply "God, the Deity."
- 14. **Eloah** (Deuteronomy 32:15; Daniel 2:11) Meaning "The One God."
- 15. El-Beth-El (Genesis 31:13; 35:7) Meaning "God of the house of God."
- El Chuwl or El Chiyl (Deuteronomy 32:18; Psalm 139:13) Meaning "The God who gave you Birth."
- 17. **El Deah** (I Samuel 2:3; Romans 11:33; I Corinthians 1:18, 21 & 24) Meaning "A God of Knowledge."
- 18. **El-Elohe-Yisrael** (Genesis 33:20) Meaning "God, the God of Isra'el," or "God, the God of the Prince of God."

19. **El Elyon** (Genesis 14:18, also Daniel 4:24-27) Meaning "The Most High God," or the "Supreme" or "Uppermost." Melchizedek was the "Priest of the Most High God." The implication in the name "Most High" is that El Elyon is the "Possessor of Heaven and Earth." In the passage from Daniel, Daniel is given the interpretation of the dream of Nebuchadnezzar by the "Most High" as V24 starts and the passage continues referring to the "Most High."

20. **El Emunah** (Deuteronomy 7:9) Meaning "**The Faithful God**." The one who keeps covenant and mercy.

El Gibbor (Isaiah 9:6, 7; Jeremiah 32:18, 19) Meaning "Mighty God," or "Great God." Isaiah 9:6, 7 carries a list of some of the English translations of the names and characteristics of our wonderful God.

El Hakabodh (Psalm 29:2, 3; Acts 7:2) Meaning "The God of Glory." The one beyond compare.

23. El Hay (Joshua 3:10) Meaning "The Living God."

El Hayyay (Psalm 42:8) Meaning "God of my Life." The one to whom we pray.

El Kanna (Exodus 20:5) Meaning "Jealous God." One who will allow no other to receive glory or worship.

26. **El Kanno** (Joshua 24:19) Meaning "**Jealous God.**" One who will not permit the worship of another without withholding forgiveness.

27. **El Marom** (Micah 6:6-8) Meaning "God Most High." One who requires us to act justly, love mercy and walk humbly before him.

28. **El-Nasa'** (Psalm 99:8; Nehemiah 9:17) Meaning "A Forgiving God." One who longs for us to come to the place where He can forgive us.

29. El Nekamoth (Psalm 18:47) Meaning "God that Avenges."

30. El Nose (Psalm 99:8) Meaning "God that Forgave."

31. **El Olam** (Genesis 21:33) Meaning "The Everlasting God." The word "Olam" carries with it the implication of secrecy or being unknown, especially in the sense of no-one knowing when God starts or ends. Eternity of Being. It also carries the implication that He is God over all things everlasting.

32. El Ro'i or El Rohi (Genesis 16:13, 14) Meaning "The God who Sees" or "Omniscience." Nothing can be hidden from Him, not even our thoughts.

El Sali (Psalm 42:9) Meaning "God, my Rock." The totally dependable one, but we mustn't confuse our will with His - His which is the best for us.

Usually (mis-) translated as "Almighty God" where the word Almighty doesn't convey the true meaning. The first occurrence of this name is in this verse, where Almighty God appeared to Abraham at the age of 90 years old and told him to 'reproduce' himself, since El Shaddai is quite capable of enabling (or sufficient to enable) Abraham to do this!

El Shimchah Gyil or El Shimchath Gili (Psalm 43:4) Meaning "God, my Exceeding Joy." He causes us to praise Him simply for the way in which He causes His joy to well up inside us.

Eli Malekhi (Psalm 68:24) Meaning "God my King." Who is seen to be God and King.

37. **Elohe Mauzi** (Psalm 43:2) Meaning "God of my Strength." One who gives me strength.

38. Elohenu Olam (Psalm 48:14) Meaning "Our

(Psalm 48:14) Meaning "Our Everlasting God."

Bighteousness." The One who causes us to be righteous in His eyes.

40. **Elohe Tishuathi** (Psalm 18:46; 51:14) Meaning "God of my Salvation." One to be exalted in His righteousness.

Elohe Yakov (or Ya'akov) (Psalm 20:1) Meaning "God of Jacob (Ya'akov)" or "God of Isra'el," Jacob being one of the collective names of the nation of Isra'el. The fact that the letter of Ya'acov was renamed by the translators of the King James (Authorised) Version really had nothing to do with the anti-Semitism rife at the time (and now!) - of course! Naturally, it is because the king's name at the time was James. Almost only in the English language versions of the Bible is this change made, most other major language versions use the proper name of Ya'akov or Jacob.

42. Elohe Yisrael

(Psalm 59:5) Meaning "God of Israel."

- Elohim (Genesis 1:1; 1:26) Meaning "God," or "God, the Strong Creator." Note that in the Hebrew language, any word ending in "-im" is a plural word. Thus, we see the hidden meaning of the trinity of which now we know, even in the very first verse of Scripture. Also used as a term of deference to such as a magistrate, or as a superlative.
- Elohim Bashamayin (Deuteronomy 4:39; Joshua 2:11) Meaning "God in Heaven." There is no other God, in heaven or anywhere else.
- Elohim Chaseddi (Psalm 59:10) Meaning "The God of my Mercy."
- 46. **Elohim-Elyon** (Psalm 91:1, 2; 78:56) Meaning "God the most high."
- 47. Elohim-Kedoshim (Joshua 24:19) Meaning "Holy God."
- 48. **Elohim-Ma arakah Yisrael** (I Samuel 17:45) Meaning the "God of the Armies of Israel." David didn't alone defeat the Philistines, the God of the armies of the Hosts of Israel did that.
- 49. Elohim Machase Lanu (Psalm 62:8) Meaning "God our Refuge."
- 50. Elohim Ozer Li (Psalm 54:4) Meaning "God my Helper."
- 51. Elohim-Saboath or Elohim Tsebaoth (Psalm 80:7, 14) Meaning "God of hosts. Omnipotence."
- 52. Elohim Shophtim Ba-arets (Psalm 58:11) Meaning "God that Judges the Earth," or "God that Judges in the Earth."
- 53. Elohim Tzva'ot (2 Samuel 7:8) meaning "God of Armies" or "God of hosts."
- Elohim Yachal (Psalm 43:5, Romans 5:1-5, 15:13) Meaning "The God of Hope." This Hope that isn't like an earthly hope of "it might be, if we're lucky." This Hope in our God is a certainty! What He says MUST come to pass.
- 55. **Elohim Yakol** (Daniel 3:17) Meaning "The God who is Able." The meaning is emphatic. Most definitely, our God IS able to ...

56. **Gelah Raz** (Daniel 2:28) Meaning "Revealer of Mysteries." This is simply because there is nothing that can be hidden from our God.

57. **Ha-Melech Jehovah** (Psalm 98:6) Meaning "The Lord the King." One before whom we should make a joyful noise.

58. Immanu-El

(Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:21-23) Meaning "God with us."

59. Immanu-El (John1:1-3; 14:14-18) Meaning "God made flesh" or "The Incarnate Logos." Logos meaning "Word" of God, the living Word.

60. **Jah** Jehovah. (Exodus 15:2; 17:16; Psalm 68:4) An abbreviated form of

61. Jehosh'aphat

(Joel 3:12) Adonai Judges

62. **Jehovah** (Genesis 2:4; Exodus 6:2, 3; 34:6) Also known as

YHWH, pronounced YAHWEH (or YAHVEH) in Hebrew, **Jehovah** is the English rendering. The meaning is - "**Lord**" or "**ADONAI**" literally, "**He that is who He is**." From this follows the meaning "**The Eternal I AM**." When Moses asked who he should say sent him, the Lord answered "**I AM THAT I AM**." Thus God is "**I AM** (add whatever function or capability is appropriate for the moment)." See also **Ehyeh Asher Ehyeh** It can also be translated as "**The self existent one**." **Jehovah** is the redemptive **name** of the deity, showing this particular relationship between God and His people – Isra'elite (Jews) and believers. **Jehovah** is also the base of the compound names of our God which follow.

63. Jehovah Adon Kol Ha-arets (Joshua 3:11) Meaning "The Lord, the Lord of all the Earth."

64. **Jehovah-Bore** (Isaiah 40:28) Meaning "The Lord Creator." The One who never faints or grows weary of creating.

65. **Jehovah Chereb** (Deuteronomy 33:29) Meaning "The Lord ... the Sword." The helper of His people.

66. **Jehovah El Elyon** (Genesis 14:22) Meaning "The Lord, The most high God."

67. **Jehovah El Emeth** (Psalm 31:5 Meaning "**Lord God of Truth**." Unlike Satan who is the father of all lies.

68. **Jehovah El Gemuwal** (Jeremiah 51:56) Meaning "The Lord God Recompenses." As in good for good or evil for evil.

69. **Jehovah Eli** (Psalm 18:2) Meaning "**The Lord my God**." And many other things, as this verse reveals.

70. **Jehovah Elohe Abothekem** (Joshua 18:3) Meaning "The Lord God of your fathers."

71. **Jehovah Elohe Yeshuathi** (Psalm 88:1) Meaning "Lord God of my Salvation."

72. **Jehovah Elohe Yisrael** (Psalm 41:13) Meaning "The Lord God of Israel from everlasting, and to everlasting. Amen, and amen." So be it and so be it.

Jehovah Elohi (Genesis 2:4; 3:9-13, 21; Exodus 34:6) Meaning "Lord God," or "The Redeemer-Creator." Also the various meanings as above combined. This then shows the redemptive nature of our God to the Israelite (or Jews as they are collectively known today, although strictly this should only apply to the descendants of the tribe of Judah) and the believers. This is also the name of Jesus in the Old Testament.

74.**Jehovah-Elohim-Saboath** (Psalm 59:5; 84:8; Jeremiah 15:16) Meaning "The Lord God of Hosts." That is, of the hosts of Heaven, Creation and all Creatures.

75. Jehovah Elohim Tsebaoth (Psalm 59:5) Meaning "Lord God of Hosts."

76. **Jehovah-Elyon** (Genesis 14:18-22; Psalm 7:17) Meaning "The Lord Most High."

77. **Jah-Elohim** (Psalm 68:18) Meaning "Lord God."

78. **Jah-Jehovah** (Isaiah 12:2; 26:4) Meaning "**Lord Jehovah**" for double emphasis. In the Hebrew language, words or phrases are repeated for emphasis.

79. **Jehovah-Ga'ah** (Isaiah 49:14) Meaning "The Lord thy Redeemer."

80. **Jehovah-Gibbor** (Psalm 24:8; Isaiah 42:13) Meaning "The Lord is Mighty in Battle."

81. Jehovah Goelekh (Isaiah 49:26; 60:16) Meaning "The Lord thy Redeemer" 82. Jehovah Haskopet (Judges 11:27) Meaning "The Lord the Judge." 83. Jehovah-Hosenu (Psalm 95:6) Meaning "The Lord our Maker." 84 Jehovah Hoshiah (Psalm 20:9) Meaning "O Lord Save." 85. Jehovah Immeka (Judges 6:12) Meaning "The Lord is with you." 86 Jehovah Izuz (Psalm 24:8) Meaning "The Lord Strong and Mighty." 87. **Jehovah-Jireh** (Genesis 22:13-14) Meaning "The Lord our provider" or "The Lord shall provide." As in this passage in Genesis, where the Lord provided the ram for the sacrifice rather than Abraham sacrificing Isaac. **Jehovah Jireh** is sometimes jokingly corrupted by those "on the dole" or "on benefits" to be, Jehovah Giro! Perhaps this is why the bank is named the "Giro Bank?" 88 Jehovah Kabodhi (Psalm 3:3) Meaning "The Lord my Glory." From this verse comes the line in that lovely old chorus "... My glory and the lifter of my head..." Wonderful! 89. Jehovah-Kanna (Exodus 20:5; 34:14; Deuteronomy 5:9) Meaning "The Lord who is Jealous." 90. Jehovah Kanna Shemo (Exodus 34:14) Meaning "The Lord whose name is Jealous." 91. Jehovah Keren-Yishi (Psalm 18:2) Meaning "The Lord, the Horn of my Salvation" 92. Jehovah Machsi (Psalm 91:9) Meaning "The Lord my Refuge."

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93. **Jehovah Magen** (Deuteronomy 33:29) Meaning "The Lord, the Shield."

94. **Jehovah Maginnenu** (Psalm 89:18) Meaning "The Lord our Defence."

95. **Jehovah Makkeh** (Ezekiel 7:9) Meaning "The Lord that Smites."

96. Jehovah Mauzzam

(Psalm 37:39) Meaning "The Lord their Strength."

Especially in time of trouble.

97. Jehovah Mauzzi

(Jeremiah 16:19) Meaning "The Lord my Fortress."

98. **Jehovah-Mekaddeskum** (Exodus 31:13; Leviticus 20:8) Meaning "The Lord who sanctifies."

99. **Jehovah Mekaddishkhem** (Exodus 31:13) Meaning "The Lord that Sanctifies you."

100. **Jehovah Melech Olam** (Psalm 10:16) Meaning "The Lord King Forever," or "The Lord is King forever."

101. Jehovah Mephalti

(Psalm 18:2) Meaning "The Lord my Deliverer."

102. Jehovah Metsudhathi (Psalm 18:2) Meaning "The Lord ... my Fortress."

103. **Jehovah Mishgabbi** (Psalm 18:

(Psalm 18:2) Meaning "The Lord my High Tower."

104. **Jehovah Moshiekh** (Isaiah 49:26; 60:16) Meaning "**The Lord your Saviour**." As the verses say "... and your Redeemer."

105. Jehovah-Nissi

(Exodus 17:8-15) Meaning "The Lord my

**Banner**." This is a banner of the type waved in a war as a rallying point to the troops. Specifically, the context is of the war against the Amelekites who represent the worldly ways to the Israelite and to us Christians.

106. **Jehovah Ori** (Psalm 27:1) Meaning "**The Lord is my Light**." As the verse says, "... and my salvation."

107. **Jehovah Raah (or Jehovah Roi)** (Psalm 23:1) Meaning "The Lord my Shepherd."

108. **Jehovah-Rapha** (or **Jehovah-Rophe**) (Exodus 15:26) Meaning "The Lord who heals," or "The Lord our Healer." This usually taken to mean a physical healing, but also means the healing of the soul and the mind.

109. **Jehovah Saboath** (I Samuel 1:3) Meaning "The Lord of Hosts." The basic meaning is implied as "The Lord of (Warrior) Hosts." However, the "Hosts" in this name has several meanings: Heavenly Bodies (Genesis 2:1, Nehemiah 9:6, Isaiah 40:26); Angels (Luke 2:13); Saints (Joshua 5:15) and Sinners (Judges 4:2, II Sam 10:16, II Kings 5:1) The Lord God is able to marshal any or all of these hosts for His purposes.

#### 111. Jehovah Sali

(Psalm 18:2) Meaning "The Lord my Rock."

Jehovah-Shalom (Judges 6:24) Meaning "The Lord our peace" or "The Lord send peace." The word "Shalom" means much more than there just being no wars, which is the world's definition of peace. It refers mostly, but not only, to a deep abiding inner peace that come from knowing the Lord God (Jehovah Elohim) in our hearts as Lord and as Saviour of our souls.

113. **Jehovah-Shammah** (Ezekiel 48:35) Meaning "The Lord is There," or "The Lord is ever-present." This name signifies the abiding presence of the Lord with His people, hence it applies to both Israel and to believers. The same as **Adonai Shamah**.

Jehovah-Shaphat (Isaiah 33:22, Ya'acov [James] 4:12) Meaning "The Lord our Judge." As the verse in Isaiah goes on to say "..., the Lord is our lawgiver." Jacob goes on to say that "There is only one lawgiver and Judge" - Jehovah-Shaphat.

Righteousness." This occurs in a prophecy specifically related to the future restoration and conversion of the nation of Isra'el, the first stage of which has come true in my own lifetime in May 1948. The nation of Isra'el will at the time of their complete restoration, declare "The Lord our Righteousness" (Jehovah-Tsidkenu) when they as a nation, turn back to the Lord God (Jehovah Elohim).

#### 116. Jehovah Tsuri

(Psalm 19:14) Meaning "The Lord my Strength."

117. **Jehovah Uzzi** (Psalm 28:7) Meaning "The Lord my Strength." Also, as the verse says "... and my Shield." It certainly puts a new perspective on the Isra'eli designed and manufactured **Uzzi** Sub-Machine gun!

Jehovah-Jehoshua-Christos (Matthew 1:21; Luke 2:11, 26, 27; Acts 2:34-36; Ephesians 1:20,21) Meaning "The Lord Jesus Christ," or "Jehovah's Saviour Anointed."

119. Maowz-Dal (Isaiah 25:4, Psalm 119:114) Meaning "A Defence for the Helpless." In the Psalm, a refuge, a Shelter or Protection from harm.

Melek Kabowd (Psalm 24:1-10) Meaning "King of Glory." We know the answers to the questions posed in V7-10, "and the King of glory shall come in" and "Who is the King of glory?" We know that Jesus *IS* the King of glory!

Olam Zerowa (Deuteronomy33:26-29) Meaning "The Everlasting Arms." As in V27, "The Eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms." These are everlasting arms as in a refuge or protection from harm by enemies etc.

Pele-Yo'etz

(Isaiah 9:6) Meaning "Wonder of a Counselor."

Rumn Ro'sh (Psalm 3:1-4:1) Meaning "The One who lifts my Head." As in no longer cowering in fear of one's enemies - especially for us Christians today in the war against Satan and his armies of demons. V3 is "But you, O Lord, are a shield for me; my glory and the lifter up of my head."

124. Sar-Shalom

(Isaiah 9:6) Meaning "Prince of Peace."

125. Shad-dai

(Ezekiel 1:24) Meaning "The Almighty."

126. **Yeshua Ha'Maschiach** (A general term used throughout the Gospels and New Testament) meaning, "**Jesus the Messiah**." Perhaps not specifically a name of our God, but included for completeness - since Jesus is God anyway.

127. Yud-Heh-Vav-Heh (Exodus 3:15) Meaning ADONAI, given to Moses to tell the Isra'elites who had sent him. Also known as: the Tetragrammaton. Sometimes rendered **Jehovah.** Meaning, usually, to mean "I AM." Actually, "the pre-existent one" or "I will be what I will be."

128. YAHU is a commonly used version of the Tetragrammaton, a contraction of which is YAH.
